



PROJECT: VISITING A VILLAGE IN ALTO ADIGE

GOALS:

- To immerse yourself into one village in Alto Adige, playing the role of tourist or trip planner to discover more about one particular place.
- To expand your thinking of Alto Adige beyond the wines and vineyards, and include culture and history.

Alto Adige is often only discussed in terms of the Germanic heritage and the main cities, Bolzano and Trento. But the essence and the beauty of Alto Adige is in the tiny villages and hamlets throughout the region.

Pick a village in Alto Adige, the smaller the better. You'll be exploring this village and learning as many details as possible about it.
